Head for the **Local Flavours** marquee at this year's Oxfordshire County and Thame Show on 31 July to feast on strawberries, wine, artisan breads, and much more, all produced in Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire.

Give your tastebuds the time of their life with spicy chutneys and hot mustards, luscious cordials and fruity gins, squidgy cheeses and flavour-packed meat pies.

Make your own sausages at Happy Herefords & Tipsy Tamworths stand.

Have a go on the Taste of Adventure. Explore the five senses we use to eat: sight, sound, touch, taste and smell in this game run by Slow Food Oxon.

More than 30 stalls in the **Local Flavours** marquee are selling jams, biscuits, breakfast cereals, organic meat and vegetables, cold pressed rapeseed oil, yoghurts, quince preserves and delicatessen goods.

Top Buckinghamshire producers in the **Local Flavours** marquee include:

- Happy Herefords and Tipsy Tamworths from Newton Blossomville, Olney demonstrating sausage-making and offering their version of the Woolworth's pic'n'mix – six any variety sausages for a fiver
- Just Biscuits from Stoke Mandeville with freshly made sweet and savoury biscuits
- Chiltern Natural Foods from High Wycombe with breakfast cereals, seeds and fresh lemonade
- Tims Dairy from Chalfont St Peter with Greek-style yoghurts and dairy produce
- PE Mead and Sons from Wilstone Green, near Tring with cold-pressed rapeseed oil
- Foxdenton Estate Company, Winslow with a range of fruit liqueur flavoured London gins

Joining them in the **Local Flavours** marquee are many Oxfordshire-based producers, Gloucestershire's top cheese-maker Simon Weaver Cotswold Organic Dairy and Berkshire's Sheepdrove Organic Farm.

The **Local Flavours** marquee is also the place to find out how to get funding from the LEADER programme for food, agriculture, community and forestry projects in Buckinghamshire, Oxfordshire and Berkshire.

The **Local Flavours** marquee is run by the Berkshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire (BBO) Food Group CIC [www.local-food.net](http://www.local-food.net) to showcase an amazing range of delicious summer food.

BBO Food Group gives marketing and trade development support to food and drink producers from the three counties, publishes a highly regarded Food Guide, and organises the Local Flavours Festival. Funding comes from Oxfordshire County Council, Cherwell District Council and The Midcounties Co-operative.

Patrice Garrigues, Ethical Trading Manager at The Midcounties Co-operative, says: "As a member-owned, community retailer we believe in local sourcing and supporting local suppliers. Our Local Harvest scheme enables us to offer quality local products sourced from a 40 miles radius in our food stores from various suppliers. And reducing food miles – the distance that food travels from field to fork – is also better for the environment."
